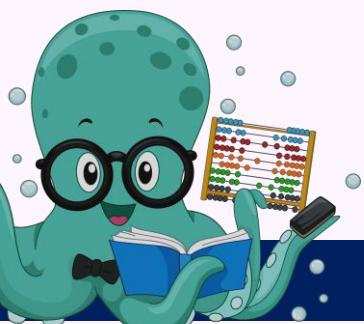

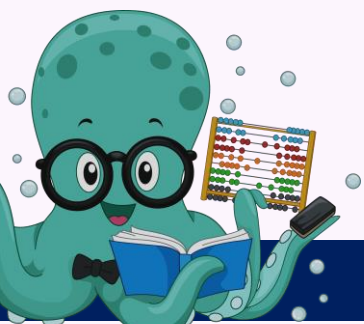

of participants, all eager to showcase their knowledge and skills in 14

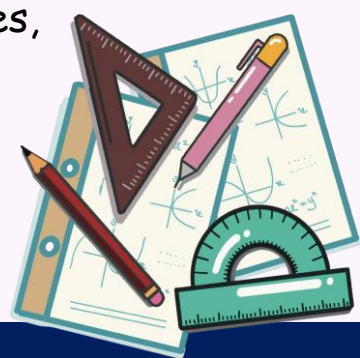
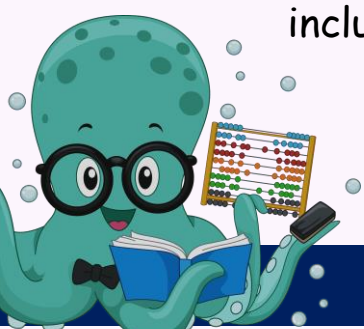
different legal topics such as Protection of women from Domestic Violence

including presentation, skit, speech, debate,





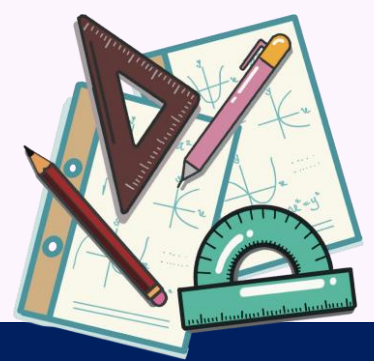
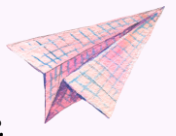

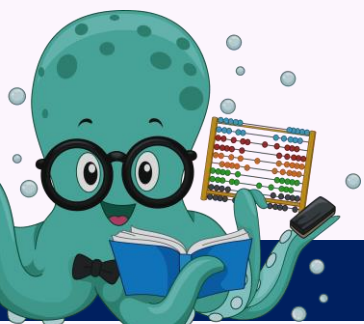
Students explored all aspects of theatre production. They participated in acting, where they learned techniques for character development and stage presence.

Music positively impacts a child's academic performance, it assists in developing social skills, and provides an outlet for creativity that is crucial for the child's overall development.

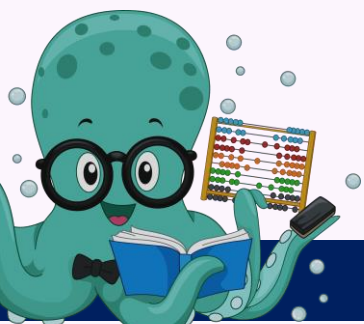


## Doll Making Activity

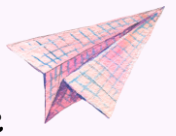

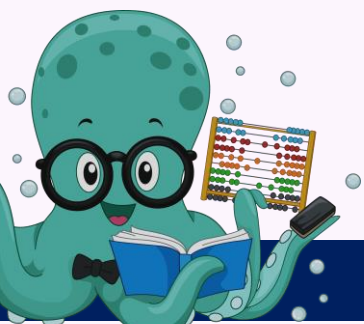


## English Storytelling Session

be found in material wealth. The students, captivated by the story, also engaged in drawing scenes from the tale, making the event an immersive blend of nature, art, and timeless wisdom.

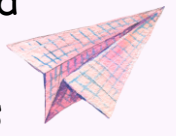


## Reading Session

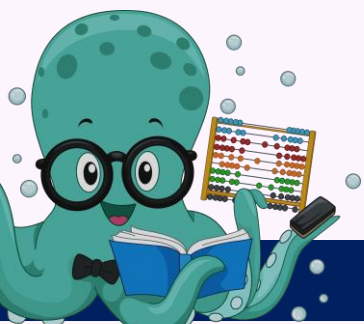

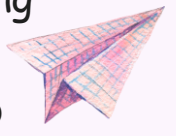


# Yoga And Aerobics Session

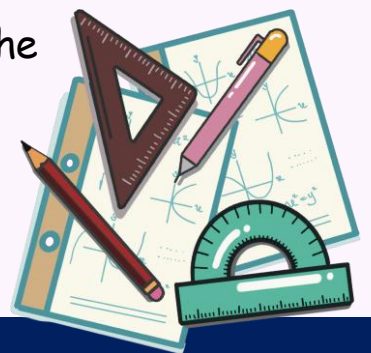
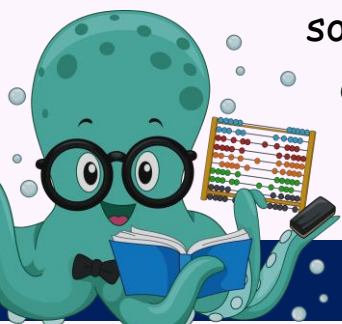
an exciting hunt, the yellow team emerged victorious, much to the delight of the audience.

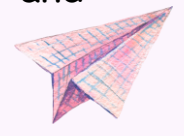
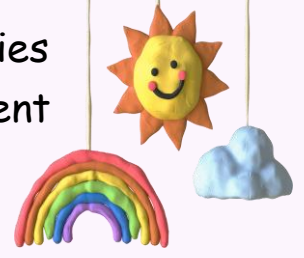

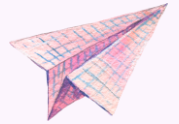
# Welcome Assembly (Grade I-V)

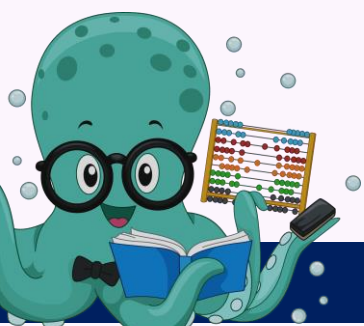
To keep everyone informed, a brief news segment covered important events and updates

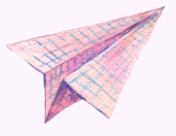
# Welcome Assembly (Grade VI-XII)

Ms Sarita set the tone for the day with a *Thought of the Day* message on positivity "You can spread positivity by creating something positive in your thoughts and actions".



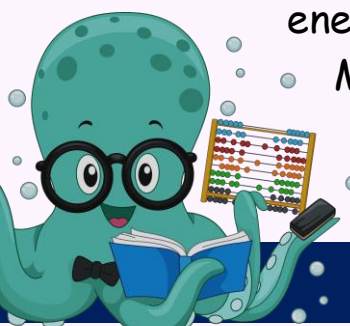
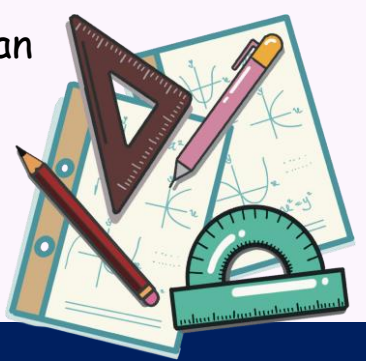

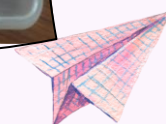
Tagore Public School, Gurugram were apprised of the importance of safety and first aid. They were explained the importance of first aid as it is the emergency care given immediately to






an injured person until appropriate medical treatment can be accessed in a hospital or before going to a doctor.

To raise awareness about safety and first aid, they were shown different videos. The students were also made aware that a first aid box is a collection of supplies and equipment that is used to give medical treatment and it should be kept in the right place with the right up-to-date items. They were explained about essential items in a First Aid Box:



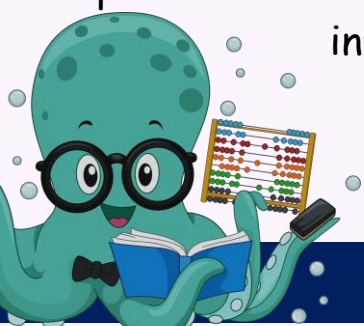
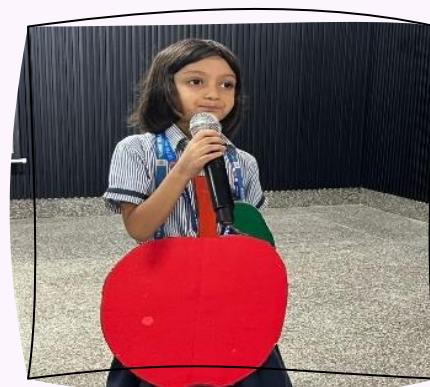
- Band-aids: For small cuts and scrapes.
- Gauze pads and adhesive tape: For larger cuts.
- Antiseptic wipes: To clean wounds.
- Tweezers: To remove splinters.
- Scissors: For cutting bandages.
- Instant cold packs: For bruises and sprains.
- Gloves: To keep hands clean while treating someone.
- A list of emergency phone numbers.

This activity helped the children learn how to make their own first aid box that can enable them to care of themselves. Through this

 activity students understood the importance of disaster management and first aid. By learning these basic skills, they can feel more confident and prepared to handle minor emergencies safely.

## Grade- I B Assembly: 'Food We Eat'

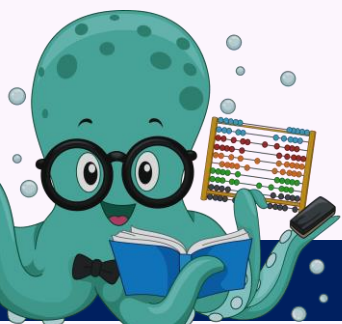

# Yoga Day

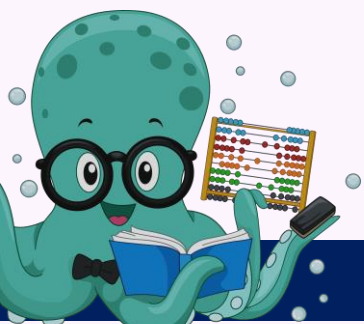

## GoSharpener - Session by Team Zomato

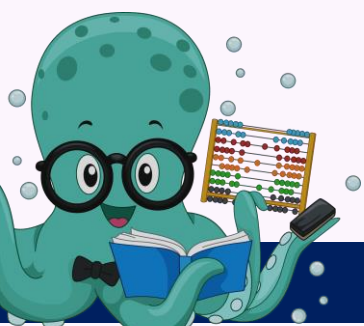

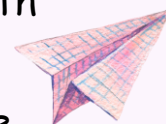
# Award Ceremony by GoSharpener

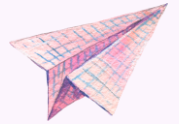

The ceremony ended with a sense of pride and accomplishment, inspiring all attendees to contribute to environmental conservation.

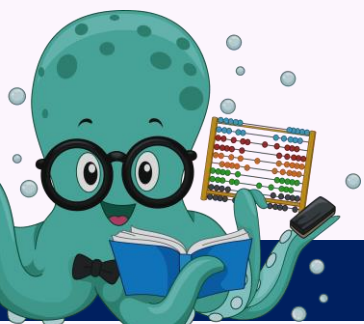
## Grade- VI A Assembly 'World Malala Day'

The assembly concluded with a short video about the Nobel prize winner, Malala Yousafzai, a Pakistani advocate for girls' education. On all those who witnessed the

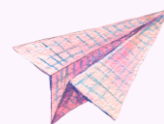


celebration of World Malala Day at Tagore Public School.

## Bioplastics Experiments of SDG in Chemistry Lab



In our recent workshop on Sustainable Development Goal' by Go Sharpener in Chemistry lab for students from Grades VI to XII explored the exciting world of plant-based plastics using simple materials such as starch, glycerine, and vinegar under



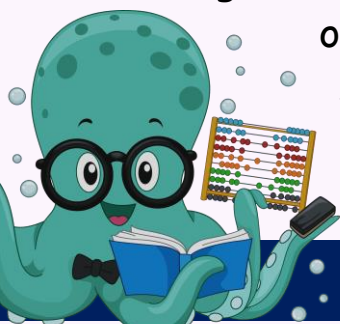
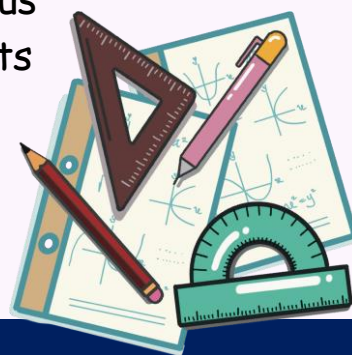
the guidance of educators Ms. Priya Arora, Ms. Shweta Sharma and Ms. Sarita of Tagore Public School.



The experiment aimed to demonstrate how these natural ingredients can be combined to create an eco-friendly alternative to traditional plastics.

The experiment showcased the toxic impact of plastic on the environment. The procedure for the experiment began with mixing 1 tablespoon starch and 1 tablespoon water, creating a thick paste. Students then added 1 tablespoon glycerine, which acts as a plasticizer, making the mixture more flexible. Finally, a small amount of vinegar was introduced to enhance the reaction. As they heated the mixture with continuous stirring until it became thick and translucent the students

observed how it transformed into a pliable substance. Once the mixture got



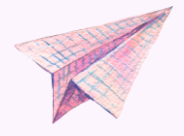


thickened, students spread the material on Aluminium foil by giving a desired shape.

Throughout the experiment, everyone was engaged actively, taking notes and discussing the properties of bioplastics.

They learned about the environmental benefits of using biodegradable materials and the significance of reducing plastic waste.

By the end of the lab activity, students not only gained hands-on experience but also deepened their understanding of sustainable practices. This project highlighted the importance of innovation in creating environmentally friendly solutions, inspiring students to think creatively about the materials we use every day.

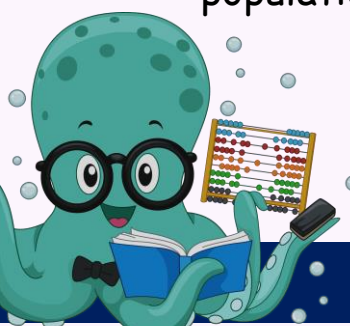
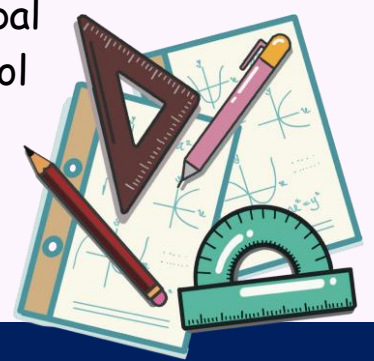


the day's theme. He shed light on the ever-growing population and its impact on our planet's resources.

## Cooking Without Fire: A House Activity

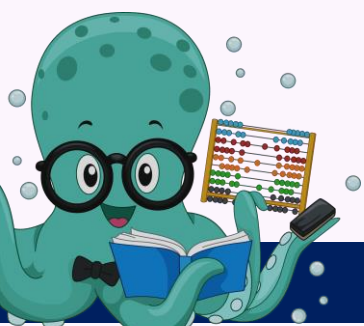

The activity was highly successful in achieving its goals, with several key outcomes:

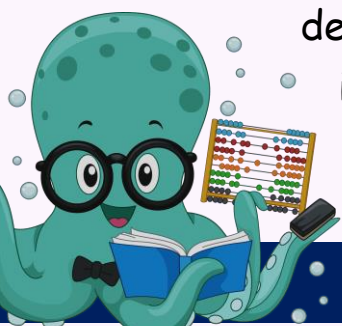
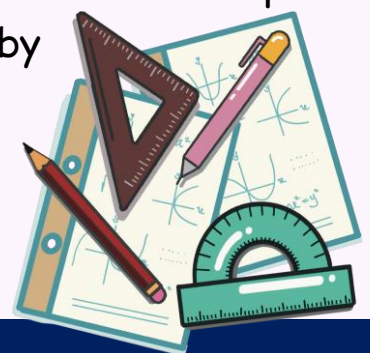
 **Healthy Eating Habits:** The children learned about the importance of incorporating fresh vegetables and fruits into their diets, fostering an appreciation for healthy food choices.

designing and assembling their salads in imaginative ways.





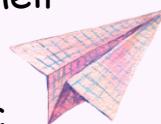
**Culinary Skills:** Basic culinary skills such as chopping, mixing, and assembling were introduced, giving the students a sense of accomplishment and independence.

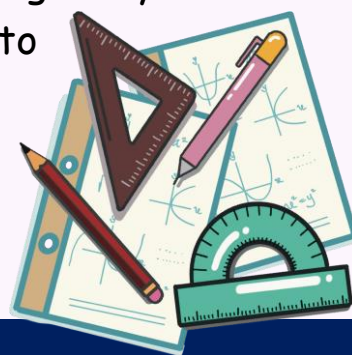
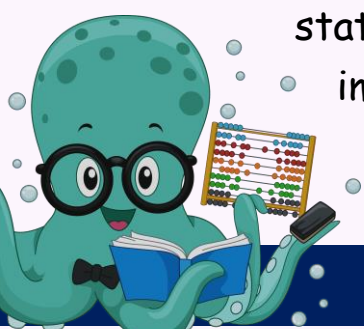


## Grade- XI Assembly Nelson Mandela International Day

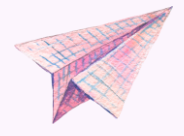


justice, bringing to life the indelible stories of resilience and hope associated with Mandela's legacy.

commitment to celebrating the extraordinary life of Nelson Mandela and the ideals he stood for.



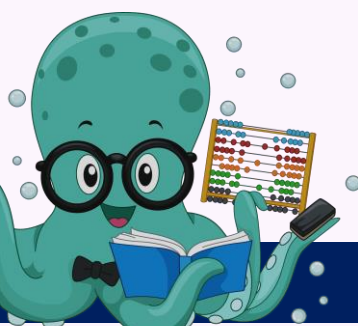
## Cleanliness Drive

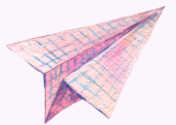

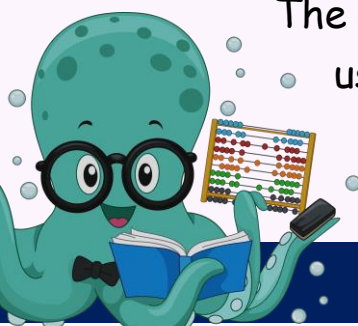
 one on one attention was given to each child so that the concept of phonetic sound and concept of letters is clear.

The nursery assembly was a great success! The use of picture flashcards and phonetic



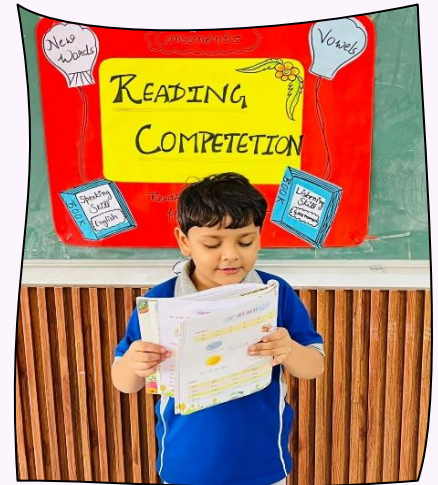

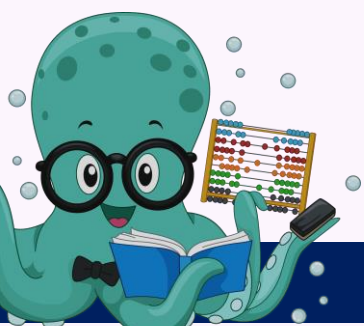
## Reading Competition

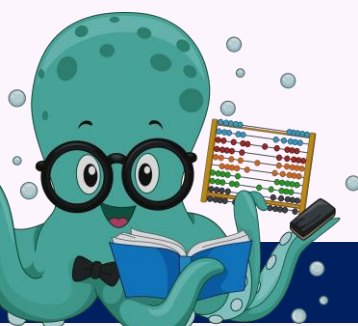
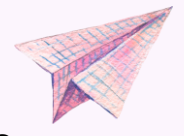
# Spell- O- Thon

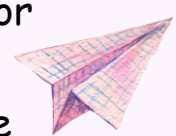
## Social Media Giving Day

## My Favourite Rhyme

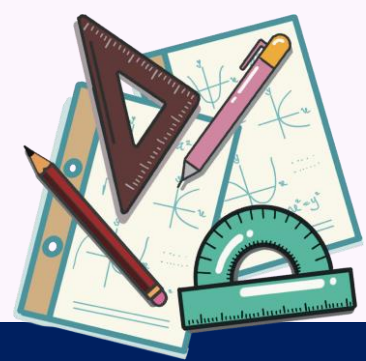
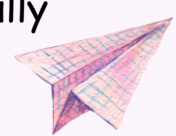

# Hands-on Learning: Sorting Nouns

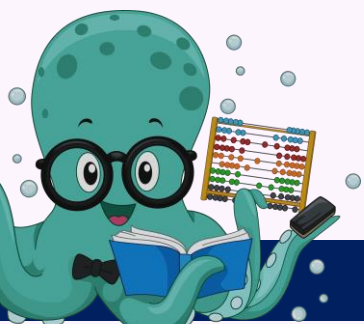

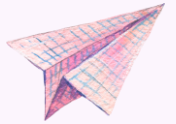
## 'My Dream House'

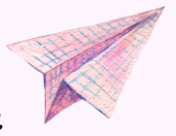


# Art Integration with EVS

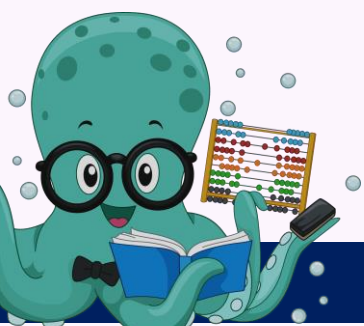


## Cloth Printing Activity

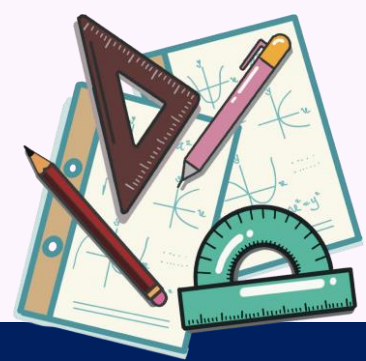
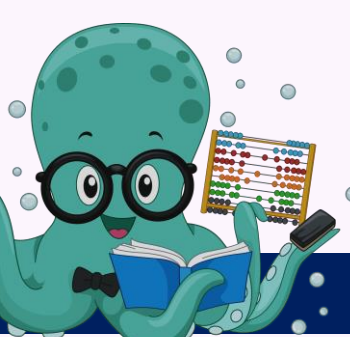

## A Gesture of Gratitude for Our Soldiers

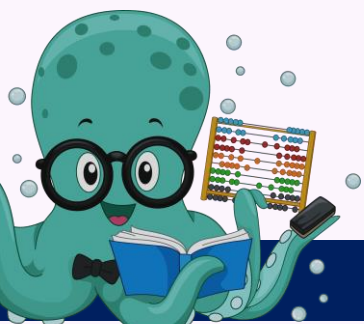
