My First day Activity - My Passport

Grade- III

HAND WASH ACTIVITY (Grade: Nursery - 3rd)



On World Health Day (07.04.2025), the children participated in an engaging and educational handwashing activity that taught them about the importance of hygiene and how to properly wash their hands to stay healthy. The lesson began with a brief discussion on the role of handwashing in preventing the spread of germs and illnesses.

The children were shown how germs can be easily transferred from surfaces to their hands and then to their faces, mouths, or other people, which can lead to sickness. They were then guided step by step through the correct handwashing process: wetting hands with water, applying soap, scrubbing all areas of the hands (front, back, between the fingers, and under the nails), and rinsing thoroughly under clean water.





The children practiced the technique, making sure they spent at least 20 seconds washing their hands. They also learned the ideal times to wash their hands, such as before eating, after using the bathroom, after sneezing or coughing, and after playing outdoors.

To make the lesson even more interactive, the children were shown a colourful poster illustrating the steps and were given the opportunity to try washing their hands at a sink with supervision. They enjoyed the hands-on experience and seemed eager to practice what they had learned.

By the end of the session, the children understood how this simple habit could significantly reduce the spread of germs and keep them healthier, and they left feeling proud of their new skills.
